President's Note

Greetings from the "winterless north" . As I write this a tropical low is bearing down on us producing very strong easterly winds and hopefully some reasonable rain, after what has been one of the driest Julys on record here and over much of the country. Perhaps we are in for a wet spring with calving and lambing about to start.

The autumn bull sales seem to have gone reasonably well with most recording averages on a par to above last year although some struggled to clear catalogues, no doubt a flow on affect from the drought and reduced cow numbers. With the spring sales only a matter of weeks away, there should be an element of optimism around with the increased dairy payout forecast, so hopefully these sales will go well.

You will all undoubtedly have seen the articles in the Farmers Weekly relating to genetic defects in beef cattle, starting with Angus and continuing with Herefords when I was approached for comment from the Hereford perspective. There are, however, some issues raised in the initial story on the front page of the Farmers Weekly that do need to be considered by members, especially by those selling bulls into the beef industry. The main issue is the "Fair Trading Act" and the seller's responsibility to declare the status of an animal when selling a known carrier of defect genes as it has been reported that some breeders continue to sell carrier animals to people that are unaware of the status of that animal. Fundamentally, breeders are not exempt from the FTA and need to think carefully about the status of animals presented for sale and the flow on effect to future business

and that of the Breed collectively.

AUGUST 2013

Murray Meads has resigned as CEO of PBB after 16 years involvement with the company. On the 1st August Murray takes up his new part time role as Events Director for Hotwire Events - the PBB subsidiary organisation which is involved in the Royal Show in Fielding later this year, Beef expo and organising the autumn beef field days around the country. We thank Murray for his contribution to the beef industry and more particularly to Herefords over the years he has been running PBB and look forward to working with him as ED for Hot Wire Events. It is envisaged that a replacement will be appointed before the end of the year and until then it is "business as usual" - we have a fantastic team in the Office at PBB and you shouldn't notice any change in services. Tammy Hendra has resigned from her role selling and servicing HM4. Support for users of this software is available from Linda Shailer from now on and any technical problem that Linda is unable to advise on - Brett Wilcock is available to assist. Registry Report

GROUP RUN CUT OFF is the 3rd of each month. An email will be sent from Breedplan alerting you to a report ready for downloading from Internet Solutions. You will only receive a report if you have data entered into the group run. The report will only be available until overwritten by the next month's run.

DNA PROFILES are required on all mating sires. They can be checked on the Hereford website under "Animal Enquiries". Remember even if it's not your bull, you will need to ensure there is a DNA profile to register progeny in your herd.

HYPOTRICHOSIS testing of males needs to be completed prior to transfer.


ONLINE REGISTRATIONS & PERFORMANCE RECORDING

Contact me if you wish to register and performance record your herd data online. A 50c/animal discount applies on registrations when submissions are accurate.

OBSERVED PADDOCK MATINGS Using the 'Observed Paddock Mating' service code 'O' when recording calves - a mating date must be submitted, when entering the 'O' or 'A' code. This must be an observation of the successful mating – signs that a cow has been bulling is not sufficient. The use of tail paint or heat detectors is recommended.

MateSel **Optimised Mating Allocation**



Deciding which bull is mated to which cow has a major impact on the rate of genetic improvement, inbreeding levels and overall profitability being achieved by a herd.

MateSel enables breeders to optimise breeding outcomes by creating a suggested mating list based on a list of candidate sires and dams.

MateSel is a valuable addition to the BREEDPLAN suite of tools and provides beef cattle seedstock producers with a guide for objectively optimising mating allocations to reflect their breeding goals and creating long term, sustainable genetic gains. The genetic gains are based on a nominated selection index, while constraints are applied on inbreeding to ensure genetic diversity is maintained or improved.

Developed by Brian Kinghorn at the University of New England, MateSel has been implemented in the American pig industry to great effect with sustainable genetic gains being achieved whilst maintaining diversity, all resulting in improved profits.

What does MateSel do?

MateSel creates a list of optimal matings for a group of candidate animals limited by parameters as set by the individual breeder. Using the MateSel software a breeder can:

- Set parameters and constraints for the MateSel analysis such as the desired breeding objective (i.e. a target selection index) and the breeding strategy being targeted including "Diversity", "Balanced" or "High Gain"
- Nominate a list of candidate sires for the breeding program. » This can range from a specific list of animals that are known to be available, to a broad list of potential animals for the breeding program.
- Select a list of candidate females available for mating based on inventory lists, age groups, last calving and registration status.
- Specify mating groups to suit their joining program including such things as heifer versus mature cow matings, and natural versus AI matings.
- Set maximum usages for sires and minimum cow mob sizes for natural matings.

Once the MateSel analysis in completed based on the breeder specified parameters, a MateSel report and suggested mating allocation list (in csv format) will be provided.

The MateSel report consists of several sections including:

- 1. Mating list sorted by sires
- 2. Mating list sorted by dams
- 3. Summary outcome statistics comparing dams, sires and progeny
- 4. Graphs showing effect of MateSel strategy on BREEDPLAN EBVs and Indexes
- Graphs showing effect on inbreeding and age structure

What Benefits does MateSel have for Individual Breeders

MateSel enables individual breeders to:

- » Maximise the rate of genetic gain in their herd and manage inbreeding at the same time
- » Add significant value to their business by way of additional genetic gain and management of inbreeding to offset the cost of pedigree and performance recording
- Save significant time previously spent compiling mating lists.
- Make informed decisions about semen purchases, which bulls to use, animal selection or culling, mating group formation and mate allocations
- » Include objectivity and proven science in their mating decisions

How do Breeders Access MateSel?

There are 2 simple steps involved in the MateSel analysis

- The breeder nominates a list of candidate sires and dams. 1
- 2. The breeder outlines the MateSel parameters including the "target" selection index, maximum number of matings for each sire, minimum cow mob size for natural matings, and selects from one of three breeding strategies ranging from "High Gain", "Balanced" and "Diversity".


The above information is provided to a BREEDPLAN MateSel operator via an Microsoft Excel template available on the BREEDPLAN website.

Development is underway so that BREEDPLAN members will be able to access the MateSel software through a webinterface via a secure login and undertake the MateSel analysis on their own herd, in their own time, without the need for a consultant.

Can MateSel be utilised by all Seedstock Herds?

As MateSel optimises the rate of genetic progress based on a selection index, MateSel can only be utilised by herds that are:

- A current member of BREEDPLAN.
- A member of an Australian Breed Society that has at least one selection index published.
- Be a member of an Australian Breed Society that has an ILR2 Pedigree and Performance database system.



NOMINATIONS WANTED Honda Motorcycles Herd of Excellence 2013-14

The Honda Motorcycles NZ Herefords Herd of Excellence is again open to nominations from clubs or individuals for the 2013-14 round. Breeders from anywhere in NZ can make a nomination, but the nominee must be a North Island breeder.

The 2013 competition is open to any NZHA North Island breeder – irrespective of herd size. The overall winner will be deemed a 'quality Hereford operation' over and above other operations entered in the competition, regardless of herd size differences.

A panel of judges will be invited to review all entrants based on the written farm profile submitted by all entrants. Depending on numbers, finalists may be selected based soley on the written profiles. However if small numbers (ie less than five) of nominations are received it is likely that all entrants will be visited. The winning Herd of Excellence will be announced in conjunction with the NZHA meal at AgInnovation/Beef Expo 2014.

Nominations:

All financial NZHA members are welcome to make a nomination. A nomination can be undertaken by an individual, syndicate or affiliated Hereford club. Breeders are also welcome to nominate themselves. A nomination form has been included with this edition of the newsletter for convenience. If nominating another party, it is crucial the nomination form be signed by the breeder being put forward to the office.

When considering breeders for nomination please keep in mind the following aspects; quality of the Hereford herd, performance of the herd, marketing, overall farm performance, farm presentation, sustainability (both financially and environmentally), the breeders' contribution to Herefords and their own community.

Once nominations have been received by the close off date, Friday October 25 2013, (see time line) all nominees will be provided with and asked to complete a written farm profile within a given time frame and return it to the NZHA office.

The judging process:

The judging panel, appointed by the NZHA Council and office will be provided with copies of all written profiles from which they will select the herds and properties to be visited in person in late summer/early autumn. That same judging panel will visit all those finalists in consecutive visits before making their final decision for the recipient of the Honda Motorcycles Hereford Herd of Excellence title.

Public Event:

A public event recognising and celebrating the achievement is to be hosted by the recipient/s of the Honda Motorcycles NZ Herefords Herd of Excellence title. All entrants are asked to indicate an approximate time of hosting such an event at time of entry.

Beef is beef...?

Beef is beef – or is it? Does an injection of dairy genes into a beef herd mean the meat will be different once the skin comes off?

Recent research comparing meat characteristics of four breed lines of crossbred 20-24 month old steers suggests there are no significant differences between different dairy and beef breed cross animals. The parameters tested included pH, meat colour, fat colour, shear force test (tenderness), expressed juice drip loss, cooked weight loss, muscle fibre makeup, intramuscular fat levels and fatty acid composition. The IMF and fatty acid composition results are yet to be released and may show variability although there were no significant differences in the ultrasound scanning IMF levels.

Massey University beef researcher Rebecca Hickson led the research using the Beef + Lamb NZ funded efficiency cowherd on the university's Tuapaka research farm and says the results are interesting as they conflict with common opinion in the industry and the price signals that buyers at auction give to producers.

"All the steers were ½ Hereford and at least ¼ Angus, so the dairy component is obviously diluted and doesn't impact on meat quality, but the dairy genetics of the dam do inject a high milking potential which is good for pre-weaning growth."

Born in 2010 to dairy beef cross or purebred Angus mothers and

a Ezicalve Hereford sire, growth rates of the Hereford X Angus X Friesian (HxAxFr) and Hereford X Angus X Kiwicross (HxAxK) calves showed greater daily gain, reflecting the higher milking potential of the dairy cross dams, with the Hereford X Angus X Jersey (HxAxJ) cross and the non-dairy cross Hereford X Angus (HxA) smaller than the other two at weaning. The heifer calves were sold as yearlings through the Feilding weaner fairs in 2011 and black whitehead calves (predominantly HxAxF and HxA, but including some of all breeds)sold at a \$45/hd premium over brown, whitehead calves (HxAxJ and HxAxK) of the same livewight.

"The Hereford x Angus grew at a faster rate post-weaning but the similarities in meat quality suggest the premium was not based on anything the farmer would get paid for after slaughter," Hickson said.

The next crop of calves are 18 months old and will be finished to final weight before undergoing similar testing.

Feed efficiency and production efficiency would be interesting to study, Hickson said, given that the heaviest (Angus) cows weaned the smallest calves but they made up ground post-weaning and grew to produce heavier carcases than HxAxJ and HxAxK lines.

"The cow efficiency experiment so far shows that although the straightbred Angus cows were in better condition through good and bad periods, their weaning efficiency is less."

By slaughter time, the HxAxFr steers were the biggest but the HxA had the highest dressing out 51%, followed by the HxAxFr at 50% and the two dairy crosses, HxAxK and HxAxJ at 49%.

Future research focus for cow efficiency herd:

- » Cow longevity: Looking at whether udders are more likely to break down in the dairy cross breeds by measuring calf colostrum levels. Dairy assessors have inspected the cows at 4 years and beef cow structure assessors will inspect them at 5 years of age. Angus cows tend to be 1 BCS better throughout life – but what are the impacts on longevity/ pregnancy rates, particularly in periods of feed shortage.
- » Breed effect on post-partum anoestrus looking at whether there is an advantage in Jersey breed
- » Environmental impact over winter running different breeds but same kgLW/ha on hill country examining pugging damage, using pasture cages to compare rates of pasture recovery and accumulation.
- » Effects of different feed delivery on growth rates calves will be wintered on four treatments; set stocked on pasture, break-fed and back fenced on pasture, break-fed on oats, break-fed and back fenced on pasture with wet weather option for feeding baleage on feed pad in rain. Looking at growth, welfare (lying time, effect of mud) and pasture damage and repair.
