### Registry Report

WEIGHTS AND SCANNING CUT-OFF FOR THE MONTHLY GROUP RUN IS THE 3RD OF EVERY MONTH

### PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING ADDITION TO THE HYPOTRICHOSIS RULING –

From 1 January 2014, ALL bulls (of any age, including calves) sold for transfer must be correctly sire verified in conjunction with having a DNA profile. Also must be tested and declared FREE of hypotrichosis.

#### ONLINE REGISTRATIONS & PERFORMANCE RECORDING

Contact me at the Office if you wish to register and performance record your herd data online. You need internet and an email address to use this system. You will receive a 50c/animal discount on registrations when submissions are accurate.

#### **OUTLIERS**

Some of you may have received outlier reports with your latest group run Herd reports.

It is IMPORTANT that these outliers are verified with Hereford registry, to ensure the animal in question and its progeny are reinstated into the Group run analysis.

IMPORTED SIRES AND DAMS Breeders are reminded that before calves can be recorded from imported semen/embryos the

sire/dam must be registered with the NZ Hereford Association. Information regarding "Rules & Regulations" can be found in the Herd Book. Artificial Insemination Regulations.

If unregistered semen/embryos are used and all the documentation is not available breeders run the risk of not being able to register the resulting progeny in New Zealand.

Breeders importing genetics need to initiate the process by ensuring the exporter has supplied the correct documentation to the Association of the animal's country of origin and requested formal documentation be sent to NZHA.

### Tom Nixon

Australia Herefords Ambassador 2013

Commercial and stud Hereford operator Tom Nixon from Queensland was chosen as the recipient of the inaugural Herefords Australia New Zealand Youth Exchange Program.

The 29-year-old principal of Devon Court Herefords and former President of the Queensland Regional Breed Development Group toured New Zealand for two weeks in April 2013 where he received a healthy taste of the international Hereford market.

Tom has been breeding Herefords since the age of 17 and after completing Year 10 at Scots College Warwick, he went onto a Certificate 3 in Animal Husbandry at Longreach Pastoral College, Queensland, before returning to run the family farm.

"I really enjoy breeding Herefords, and because I've previously travelled to the US and Canada, New Zealand was the next step. I was keen to see the differences in their breeding and farming operations", he said.

Tom added that having seen a number of Australian studs using NZ genetics, it made sense to investigate how this could be of benefit to his breeding programme. Tom also reported that while a number of NZ breeding objectives are very different, a lot of bulls bred in NZ are specifically designed for the dairy industry where low birth-weight and short gestation length are paramount. However, bulls bred to produce grass fed beef cattle are doing very

"The experience definitely lived up to my expectations, and I hope that over time I will be able to put some of these methods I learnt into practise myself."

Herefords Youth Committee Chairman Scott Hann said Tom was an excellent representative of the Australian Hereford industry. "I am certain Tom will be able to use this experience as a positive insight not only for his personal knowledge but also for the benefit of the whole Australia Hereford industry.

"The involvement of youth such as Tom is vital for the future of our industry and I believe we will continue to reap the benefits for years to come," Scott said.



#### Peter Gunson, Ngaruru Hereford Stud. NZHA Life Member.

Peter Gunson passed away on December 5, 2013. He was greatly respected by the rural and sporting communities of the Hawkes Bay region.

As a foundation member Peter held leading roles in the Hawkes Bay club, and was a very sound judge of sheep and cattle with Royal Show and Hereford National Show appointments. Peter always had a forthright opinion, integrity in his cattle breeding and enthusiasm for the task in hand.

A very generous man who willingly assisted young Hereford breeders, show handlers and junior judges develop their skills. Peter and his wife Gwen were one of the first NZ herds to encourage and use young overseas herdspersons.

The Ngaruru stud was the first beef herd in NZ to use embryo transplant technology and one of the first to import North American genetics by semen and embryo.

Peter was a naturally talented sportsman, particularly with respect to golf where he declined the opportunity to become a professional golfer due to future farming obligations.



#### Ian McKenzie,

The New Zealand Hereford Association lost a great supporter when Ian McKenzie passed away on December 14, 2013.

The Maryvale Stud was established in 1965 with the purchase of four heifers from Bushy Downs. Over the years more heifers were purchased and the herd increased to stabilise around 80 cows. Maryvale Herefords were frequent



successful competitors in the show ring and promoted the breed on tours and field days. Ian and wife Mary's contribution to the breed was recognised by the South Auckland club when they were made Club Life Members in 2009.

Ian and Mary were great hosts. It was a shame that Ian was so deaf as he was unable to cope with big crowds, but 'one to one' he would come up with some wonderful sayings and his wit was second to none. He loved to compete with his beloved cattle, horses and dogs.

It seemed very fitting that Ian's funeral was held at their Hamilton home and beautiful garden with his horse Cherokee and dog Trixie in attendance. A large gathering of friends and Hereford breeders were there to offer their condolences to the family.

At the 2013 National Hereford Herd Tour, the Maryvale Stud's contribution to the breed was acknowledged with a presentation to Ian and Mary.
