NZ Hereford Association Expo Entry Conditions 2012 Entries Close Monday March 5th 2012

Hypotrichosis – it is compulsory for all Hereford Beef Expo entries to be tested for Hypotrichosis. Testing is to be declared in the catalogue comments section of the entry form. **BVD** – compulsory Expo regulations apply to all entries. All animals must have been tested BVD antigen negative and have been vaccinated twice prior to Expo sale. The BVD vaccination declaration must be signed by the vendor (not necessarily a veterinarian) and the batch number of the vaccine batch administered supplied.

DNA – sires of all Beef Expo entered animals must have been DNA profiled. Please ensure that any bulls that have been used at stud have the relevant DNA profile.

TB – all entries must have been tested within the 12 months prior to the National Hereford sale, regardless of the herds testing cycle. If coming from a movement control area the animal must have been tested and cleared within 60 days of the sale.

TB and BVD declarations must be lodged with the Hereford office no later than 48 hours prior to the sale. **Selection** - ALL Hereford Beef Expo entries will be selected (inspected) by persons appointed by the NZHA Council. The cost of the selection process will be shared and invoiced by all those entered. Any animal failing to make the catalogue due to selection will have its entry fee refunded but will still be subject to any selection fees. A right of review is available to those who disagree with the outcome of the selection process. A right of appeal should be directed to Rodney Jupp. Vendors will be notified of the selection outcome as soon as practically possible following the viewing of all entered Herefords.

Starter Pack In Calf Heifers - entries will be limited to two pairs per vendor and the Hereford Expo committee reserve the right to limit entries in this class. They are also subject to the selection process.

New Heifer Class - Single Entry - In addition to the Heifer Starter Pack class, there will be a "Single Entry" in-calf Heifer class. This allows breeders to enter an individual heifer in the Beef Expo event.

Impact Sires (unled two-year-old bulls)– entries are subject to the same conditions as Super Sires with the exception being they do not have to be joined with 20 females. Unled Impact sires are to be grazed with the Super Sires. Any bull entered in the unled class cannot be displayed on a halter.

A Duplicate set of tags must be sent with animals going to grazing units. (In the case of tags being lost).

NZHA Conditions of Entry

These are as the 2011 conditions.

Performance data must enter the March 2012 group run analysis and be submitted by March 2, 2012. NO EXEMPTIONS permitted.

Expo entry will be declined, where performance data on the traits outlined below has not undergone grouprun analysis.

Performance Data required:

i). Vendors must submit the following performance data for grouprun analysis and EBV generation in the March grouprun.

- Weights a minimum of 400day and/or 600day weights
- Rib, Rump and EMA scanning information (except yearlings).
- Scrotal measurement for all two-year-old bulls.

ii). H, J, S, P codes must be recorded on the expo entry form.

2012 Yearling Expo Entries – date of birth must be after 01/06/2011. NZHA draw procedure as per previous years.

Raw Data - there will be no collection of Hereford Raw Data at Expo 2012. Breeders can however display data in stalls if desired and include it in the comments section of the entry form.

Can I remind breeders they cannot name their animals using another stud prefix.

This ruling can be found in the Conditions of Entry, Regulations and By-laws of the NZ Hereford.

DNA for mating sires!

As previously published, Breeders need to send copies or DNA of all mating sires to the Office prior to recording their calves.

Calves with no sire DNA are held and not registered until a profile is received.

OUTLIERS

Some of you may have received outlier reports with your latest group run Herd reports.

It is IMPORTANT that these outliers are verified with Hereford registry, to ensure the animal in question and its progeny are reinstated into the Group run analysis.

NAIT scheme obligations

From 1 July, the NAIT (National Animal Identification and Tracing) scheme is set to be mandatory for people in charge of cattle and from 1 March 2013 for people in charge of deer.

Obligations for people in charge of cattle and deer will be to:

- Register with NAIT to get a NAIT number
- Identify every property on which they have cattle and deer they are in charge of
- Tag cattle and deer with NAIT-approved RFID tags and register those animals with NAIT
- Report to NAIT when cattle and deer are moved off-farm or received onto a property
- Report deaths, losses or live exports of cattle and deer.

The registration process will give you a NAIT number which will be used in all subsequent NAIT transactions such as animal registration and movement recording.

You can register with NAIT now. Turn over to see how to register.

The final step to link animals to the person responsible for them, and their location is animal registration. This will be available when the scheme is mandatory.

How to register

Registration is open now for people in charge of cattle and deer. To be ready for the NAIT scheme, NAIT Limited urges you to register yourself now with NAIT if you are a person in charge of cattle and/or deer.

To register:

- Go to www.nait.co.nz and register online, or
- Contact NAIT for registration assistance by phoning
 0800 624 843, or
- Use a **NAIT-accredited information provider** to complete your registration for you. Ask your local livestock company, meat processor or rural services provider if they can help.

When you register, you will need to supply NAIT with some personal information and details about your farm.

When you create a NAIT number have your AHB herd number handy because you will be asked to provide it.

If you buy ear tags using a Participant Code, please also provide this when you register. Doing so will enable you to electronically download the tag numbers associated with your NAIT number when you register animals, rather than entering the numbers manually.

Animal registration will be available when the scheme is mandatory.
